There were two cottages and gardens at "The Shirleys" underlet to William Adkins and John Greaves.

Nailcote Farm was left by John Whitehead in 1701 to John Adkins, a "kinsman", who was a blacksmith in Berkswell.

We must assume that John and Sarah Allen had no children, because in his Will of 1737, John Allen left Nailcote Hall to John Adkins and Thomas Docker in trust for Katherine his sister who had married John Lant, and then to Katherine's son Thomas.

John Adkins, an Innkeeper from Hampton-in-Arden, descendant of the John who had been left the Farm by John Whitehead, had rented it out
